10 December, the International Human Rights Day: The National Strategy on Sexual and Reproductive Health and the National AIDS Strategy need to be rapidly adopted and implemented!

Dear Prime Minister Boc,

On 1 December 2011, the European Parliament adopted a resolution on the EU response to HIV/AIDS in the EU and neighbouring countries. The Parliament called on the Member States to honour their obligations towards the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, and to ensure that all national AIDS programmes and strategies develop strong linkages between sexual and reproductive health and HIV services and rights.¹

On International Human Rights Day, we would like to emphasise that sexual and reproductive health and rights are indeed important for the entire population. They are human rights which are under current theat due to the fact that Romania is lacking a National Strategy on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights and a National HIV/AIDS Strategy. We can no longer afford to ignore the effects of this absence:

- the number of family planning clinics were severely reduced, and the condom and other methods of contraception are no longer offered free of charge to vulnerable groups;
- women living with HIV are facing numerous obstacles in accessing sexual and reproductive healthcare services: refusals to ensure preventive measures for vertical transmission at birth, segregation in hospitals or in isolated rooms, discriminatory and degrading treatments, breaches of confidentiality regarding the HIV status;
- adolescent access to sexual and reproductive health education, including HIV prevention is very low and inconsistent, while adolescent pregnancy rate is the second highest in the European Union;

- investment in HIV prevention for key populations such as young people, gay men, intravenous drug users are not reflected into action plans and are not budgeted by the state;
- numerous ARV shortages are registered every year due to administrative and management deficiencies that put the lives of people living with HIV at risk;
- healthcare personnel lack proper and constant training on issues like universal precautions, communication with the patient, patients' rights, including respecting confidentiality, which results in discriminatory attitudes towards people living with HIV, which may result in denial of healthcare services.

We are aware that partnership between the civil society and Government made Romania several years ago into a model of success in dealing with HIV/AIDS and reproductive health. A similar mechanism placed under your high authority is greatly needed to allow and encourage various ministries, state agencies, experts and civil society representatives to adopt, implement and monitor the National Strategies on HIV/AIDS and on Sexual and Reproductive Health. Such a decision is recommended by international agencies (UNFPA, UNAIDS) and will contribute to transform human rights principles and declarations into policies with impact at the community level. Urgent action is required to assure that the needs of vulnerable groups are met and that they are included in this mechanism of cooperation and implementation, based on the respect of their right to health, dignity and non-discrimination.
